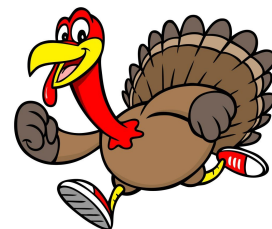
Developing the Leaders of Tomorrow

Dear Beverly Parents and Guardians,

I am asking for your help in regards to social media for our students at Beverly. Social media has become more and more popular with each passing year. We have had several big issues involving cyberbullying with our students and social media this year. These issues typically occur on Snapchat and Instagram, but they also occur on several other platforms. Recently we have discovered an app that works in conjunction with Snapchat. It is called YOLO. The YOLO app allows for students to post on someone's Snapchat account while appearing anonymous. This leads to some very awful things being said. I would appreciate it if you could either discourage your child(ren) from using social media, or at least monitor their accounts by getting their usernames and passwords, for each of their social media accounts. The age requirement for Snapchat is 13. The age requirement for YOLO is 17. I would like to encourage you to research these issues, and discuss them with your child or children.

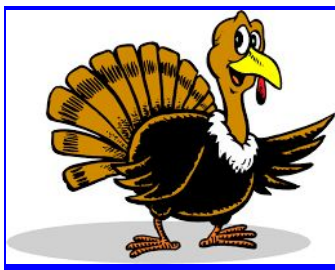

The three R's should carry over into every aspect of our students' lives!

This year, we've implemented the "Golden Spatula Award" during lunch. The Golden Spatula is awarded to the class that has best demonstrated the three R's in the lunch room. The class that earns the GS award is chosen daily and they line up first for recess. In addition, at the end of the month, the class with the most Golden Spatula tally marks wins! September's winners were the students from Mr. Bucher, Ms. Mills, Mrs. Kregel, Mrs. Bond, Mrs. Steinman, Mrs. Whaley and Mrs. Steinbock's classes. Those classrooms won an ice cream treat or box of snacks!



We are still having issues with drop off and pick up. The ONLY people parking in the Glanzman lot should be parents who are entering the building for official school business. All students should be dropped off in the drop off lane on S. Detroit. For dismissal, kindergarten and first grade parents may park in the lower parking lot, near the stadium, and walk to the doors to pick up their children. No one should be parking in the Glanzman lot. Absolutely, no parent should be using the South Toledo Urgent Care parking lot for pick up or drop off.

Some students are starting to accumulate absences. Please be advised that the State of Ohio House Bill 410 states that students are only excused, with parent notification, ten (10) days per year. Any absence, beyond the ten (10) days must have written documentation from a medical facility or doctor. Please make sure your students are in school every day and on time.

Last month I continued our classroom presentations with a presentation to the Fourth grade of the "Broken Toy" movie. This is about a boy who was bullied by his classmates. In the end he is befriended by those who bullied him. It is an emotional movie, but, very well worth watching if you have never seen it. Ask your fourth grader about it. After the movie, we split into groups and had discussions about the characters and the story and how this relates to our classmates.

The Fourth graders saw the "Bossy Franklin" video and then, talked about what it means to have a good time together without having to be bossy about it. This is important, especially, when students are on the playground together. It's not about who wins or loses, but, rather, knowing that everyone had a good time without anyone having to win or be the boss.

The Sixth and Seventh graders watched the YouTube video "I'm Not Black, I'm Not White." This is a short clip on diversity and is well done. ## November Nurse's Notes

### **Immunizations, etc.**

**Parents of 6<sup>th</sup> Graders:** The State of Ohio requires all 7<sup>th</sup> Graders to have a Tdap and Meningitis vaccine to enter school next August. You can get those immunizations now and avoid the rush! Make an appointment and get those needed immunizations, then bring a copy to school.

Parents of students who are **New To The District:** Make sure your student has an updated Immunization record at school. Not all schools have the most up-to date Immunization records! Please make sure you have completed both sides of your student's Emergency Medical Card also.

**Parents of KDG Students:** If you have not done so, please turn in a recent Physical Exam, and Dental Exam Form. **TPS requires them.**

Any and all medical records can be FAXED directly to Beverly School at; 419-671-2645

### **Students with Health Issues:**

If your student has any health or orthopedic conditions such as asthma, diabetes, severe allergies, heart, bowel or bladder problems, make sure the school is aware. If your student needs any kind of medication at school, they will need a new **Med Authorization Form** *filled out by you and the child's Healthcare Provider for every school year.* If your contact information has changed make sure you update it with our school office.

**Preventing the spread of Cold and Flu:** Now is the time to get the entire family their flu **shots**, and make sure your kids know proper nose-blowing techniques, how to cover their coughs, and how to wash their hands.

**Nutrition:** If your child is a picky eater **please see the monthly menu**, *and pack a lunch* on days when your child dislikes the food offered that day. Menus are online and attached to this Newsletter.
