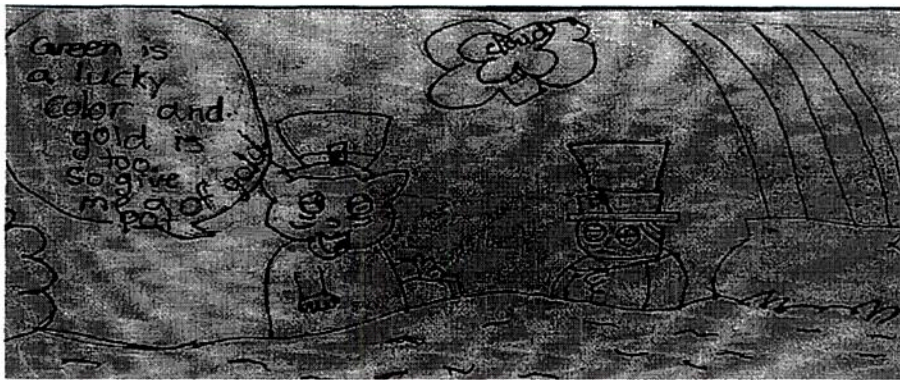
Dr. Seuss Day

Four Leaf Clover Sunny - Side - Up Eggs

You will need, eggs, butter, a bowl, water, teaspoon, a cup, a butter knife, a medium cooking pan, a four leaf clover cookie cutter, a pan lid, and a spatula. You will need to put the pan on a burner if you have a gas stove put the heat on low and if you have a regular stove put the heat on medium. After a minute put some water on your fingers and flick it onto the pan if the water sits there it's too cold, but don't turn up the heat! If the water sizzles and moves all around the pan put the butter on the knife and spread it around the pan, but not like butter on toast. If the water bounces out of the pan it's too hot. Butter the cookie cutter as well and put it in the pan. Once you have done that crack the eggs into the bowl and put the eggs in the pan and put the lid on. Baby sit the eggs and take off the lid. Then put the teaspoon in the water and pour it in. Then when the yolk is pink scoop the eggs out on a plate with the cookie cutter. Remove the cookie cutter and enjoy with toast. ~Katelyn Baringer
